

BRIDGE BUILDING BASICS

- Solid Foundation: Like a bridge, it is important to have a solid foundation built on both sides of the divide before engaging in an interreligious action, i.e. intrafaith before interfaith.
 - Deradicalizing individuals with extremist tendencies
 - Managing Misconceptions
- Know Your Terrain:
 - Wrong diagnosis = Wrong Prescription (Religion, Ethnic/Cultural,
 Minority, Indigene/Settler etc.)










Peaceful and Just Societies Where All Enjoy Freedom of Religion and Belief



- Helps the gatekeepers to pre-empt criticism from their peers who could see them as being "compromised" and therefore discredit what they are doing
- Helps them to be recognized within the community as the go-to person for such issues
- Helps them to get more community buy-in through the 'recruitment' of more intellectuals
- Helps the doorkeepers retain their dignity within the community

Realistic and peaceful alternatives to addressing the genuine grievances that adherents of a faith community may have; featuring case studies of approaches that have worked in the past.

Capacity building for the effective utilization of the various human, financial, and physical resources at their disposal for improved advocacy and action.



Promotes Understanding of the "other"; and **Addresses** common stereotypes and concerns

AGENDA SETTING FOR FORB THROUGH ADVOCACY

- Advocacy Visits politicians, policy makers, traditional rulers and other community gatekeepers
- Advocacy Talks Secondary Schools and Tertiary Institutions
- Public Forums (PF)/Opinion Leaders Seminars (OLS)
- Media Engagement

JOINT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HUMANITARIAN ACTION

- Tree Planting
- Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) projects
- Clothing for the destitute
- Soup Kitchen Project for IDP and other vulnerable persons
- Medical Caravan
- Facility support for orphanages and homes for the elderly, etc.

OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Visibility

 Intervention should be viewed as internal reform, not externally motivated. Hence, there should be zero to minimum visibility of international donor organization for maximum ownership by the community

Sensitivity in M&E

People should not feel they are being monitored or evaluated;
 so they do not feel instrumentalized.

OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Pedagogy

 An array of pedagogical tools is utilized, such as panel presentation, lecture, group discussion, reading assignments, audio materials, texts, workbook, drills, film show, excursion, edutainment & games, etc.

Inclusivity

 Nothing for/about us without us: Bring all partners on board right from the planning stage, and avoid proposals from one side 'for' the other side.

OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Neutrality

- Try as much as possible to maintain a balance with regards to number and quality of participants and facilitators, event moderation, speaking time, etc.
- Sharpening the Saw (Actors/Facilitators/Implementers).
- Do No Harm (DNH) Principle.

OUTCOMES

- Better respect for diversity and pluralism
- Better intra-faith relationships: Sunni-Shia
- Better inter-faith relations: Iftars, Christmas dinners,
 exchange of messages, visits, confirming rumours, etc.
 - Christian organization giving an Imam a Peace Award
 - Imam sheltering Christian woman's children
 - Muslim don withdrawing his Masters Thesis on Jihad for review
